The Arts Fund strengthens the business side of the arts by providing financial stabilization, strategic support, and related management consulting to arts organizations throughout the metropolitan Atlanta region. It is the only organization dedicated to building a permanent endowment to support our small and medium-sized arts organizations to ensure the long-term vitality and stability of our region's diverse arts community.

In 2006, the Metropolitan Atlanta Arts Fund's growing endowment reached \$8 million. Arts Fund stabilization grants totaling over \$500,000 were awarded to the following organizations:
